Howdy! 2009 is here already, and the Cross Timbers Chapter of the NWTF is continuing to do good things for conservation and education here in the community. We had some excellent events, helped youngsters with educational tools, and helped out 1 senior with a scholarship. Activities included hosting a JAKES event, a Women in the Outdoors event, providing a local scholarship, and providing a JAKES educational box to a local school teacher. We've also supported the Hunting Heritage Fund, and JAKES member Lynzie Albright helped us to raise \$800 to provide turkeys to WARM as part of the Turkey Hunters Care Program. The Cross Timbers Chapter received awards for 3rd place in "Highest Number of JAKES members" and 2nd place for "Most Women in the Outdoors Memberships" at the annual NWTF state awards banquet held in January. We held our **JAKES** Event in September, and had 47 kids present! The event featured shotgunning, archery, wildife habitat game, turkey calling, and dutch oven cooking.
